THE PURPOSE OF A UNITED NATIONS PARLIAMENTARY ASSEMBLY

1. To be an authoritative representative democracy

To be a truly representative voice of global public opinion at the UN and in global decision-making, becoming the ethical high-ground of democratic co-operation, standards and legitimacy, working towards continuous improvement of the global political system and decision-making processes.

2. Resolving global issues into effective policies and strategies

To gather, examine, debate, address and resolve transnational and global issues, formulating effective policies and strategies, to build social, environmental and economic stability across the world, and to examine and address issues that are not being dealt with by other bodies.

3. Becoming an important political catalyst for the further development of the international system; of international law and of an in-depth reform of the U.N. system

To research and promote best possible practice across different fields and systems, designing systemic checks and controls with feedback against corruption and the abuse of power, moderating and resolving the demand for influence between difference interest groups and reconciling differences in order to find commonality in truth, interests, beliefs, ideals and understanding, so as to develop the global institutions and the law on the basis of a continuously updated and agreed vision for the most desirable global future.

4. Aiming to become a world parliament with genuine rights of information, participation and oversight

To hold hearings, produce reports and form resolutions, to increase public oversight, transparency and accountability of global institutions and decision-making, and to take on the role of a legislative body in order to develop international law and legislation, thereby ensuring a separation of powers from the executive body that has the responsibility for implementation.
